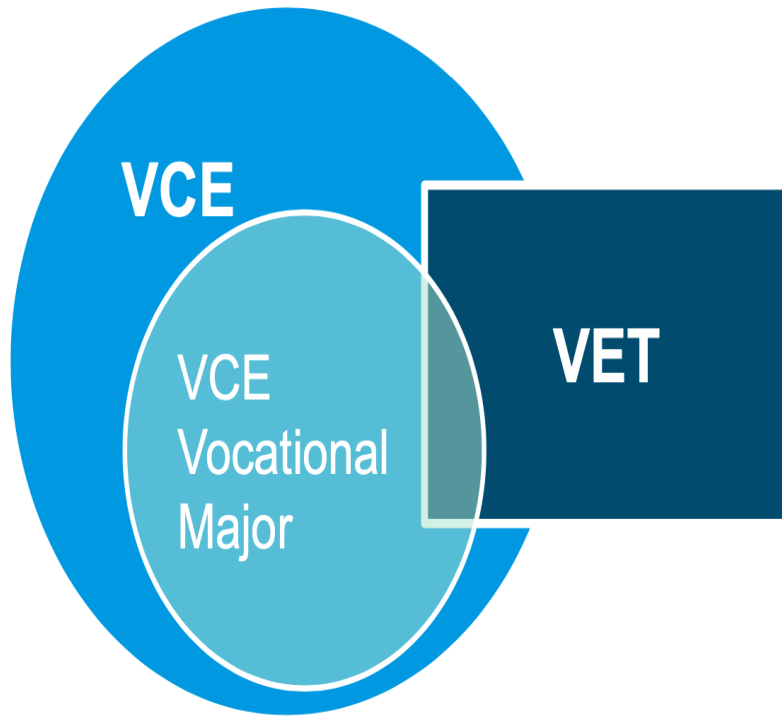

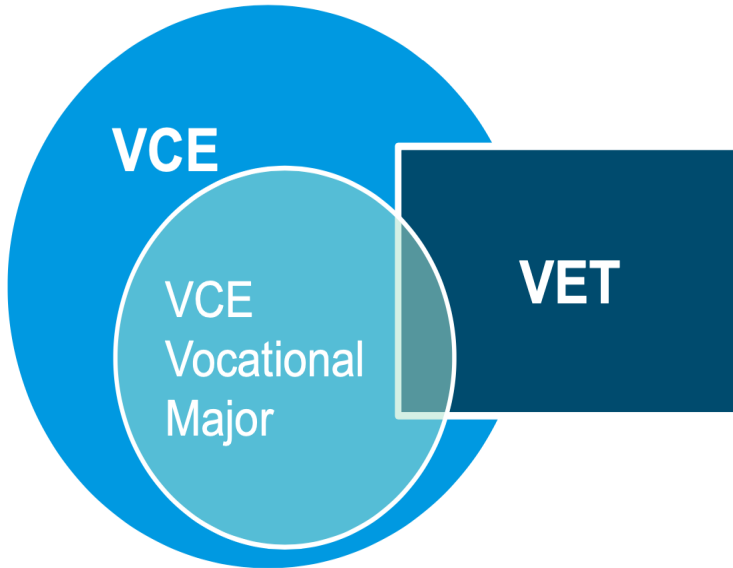
VET - Vocational Education & Training and VCE VM



VCE VM (Vocational Major)

- VCE VM replaces Senior & Intermediate VCAL
- Two year vocational and applied learning program within the VCE for Year 11 and 12 students
- Transitions into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education and training, university (through alternate entry programs) or directly into employment

VCE VM (Vocational Major)



- **VET MUST** be studied as part of a **VCE VM** and can also be studied with the VCE
- VM Allows students to include vocational studies within their senior secondary certificate through applied learning practices
- Achievement of 2 certificates at the same time
- Industry links assisting transition from school to work, training or further tertiary studies

Provides practical learning, with a focus on developing industry specific and workplace skills

Many VET programs have structured workplace learning (SWL) opportunities to put skills to practice

VET is a nationally recognised qualification & must be studied with the VCE VM

VET can contribute to the **VCE** with an ATAR

Successful completion of the VCE VM



- Each VCE VM unit of study has specified learning outcomes and are standards based. The assessment for the achievement of learning outcomes are school based and assessed through a range of learning activities and tasks.
- Unlike other VCE studies there are no external assessments of VCE VM Unit 3-4 sequences. VCE VM studies do not receive a study score. If a student wishes to receive a study score, they can choose from the wide range of VCE studies and scored VCE VET programs that contain both internal and external assessment components.
- The VCE VM studies do not contribute to the ATAR. To receive an ATAR a student must complete a scored Unit 3-4 sequence from the English group and the three other Unit 3 + 4 scored sequences. Students must achieve two or more graded assessment in these scored sequences.

VCE VM Completion Requirements

- Successful completion of a minimum of 16 units *(of the 22 studied)*
- 3 VCE VM Literacy or VCE English units *(including Unit 3–4 sequence)*
- 2 VCE VM Numeracy or VCE Mathematics units
- 2 VCE VM Work Related Skills units
- 2 VCE VM Personal Development Skills units, and
- 2 VET credits at Certificate II level or above *(180 nominal hours)*
- A minimum of 3 sequences of Units 3 and 4 studies

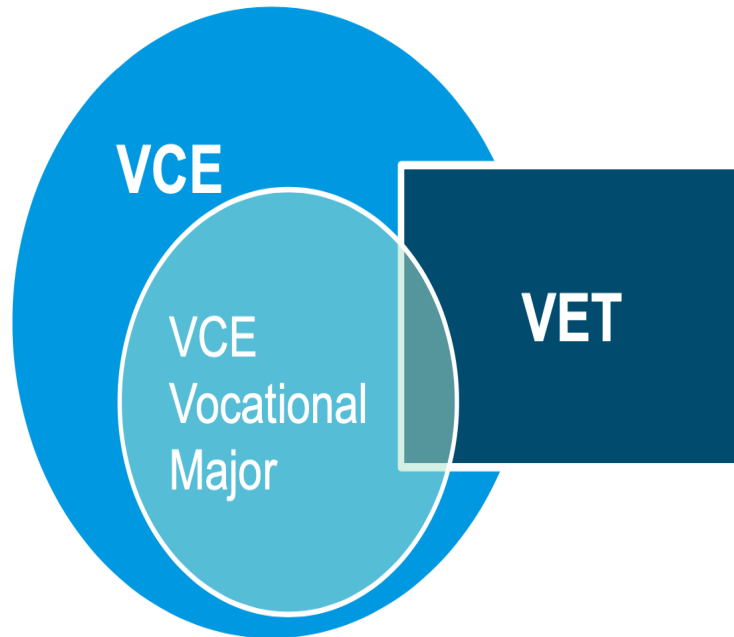

- Collect VET Expression of Interest Form (EOI) from Pathways
- Apply for a USI number **www.usi.gov.au** print 2 copies
- Return completed VET EOI form & copy of USI
- **Pathways will apply on your behalf!**
- Pathways will confirm enrolment usually Oct-Nov
- Attend VET orientation session & TAFE (*if applicable*)
- Collect the official VET enrolment pack, complete and return to Pathways
- Purchase the uniform/PPE items in preparation
- Plan your travel journey to VET and do a few practice runs on public transport

Selection Criteria for Year 11 VCE VM

To be considered for the Vermont Secondary College VCE VM program, students must actively engage in conversations with the Pathways team and meet the following entry requirements.

- Be a current Year 10 VSC student, recommended by your English teacher to study Foundation English
- A demonstrated commitment to maintaining/improving Behaviour & Effort ratings in English and other subjects where required
- An identified vocational pathway
- Keen interest in a VET program relevant to career aspirations
- A demonstrated ability to work positively with class mates and teachers in group activities
- A demonstrated positive contribution to the school community
- A commitment to personally organise work placement

Positions in the VCE VM program are limited. Once selected for the program an individual learning program will be created.
