School Saving Bonus

The School Saving Bonus will provide \$400 in one-off support for Victorian school-aged students in Term 4, 2024, for use on 2025 school costs.

Families can choose how they want to spend the School Saving Bonus. It can be used towards 2025 school costs, which may include:

- swimming and sporting programs
- outdoor education programs

Payment methods

Parent contributions towards the requested payments is essential to maintain the quality of education that we provide at Vermont Secondary College. Parents are strongly encouraged to contribute.

2025 School Contributions are available to pay via Compass and this is Vermont Secondary College's preferred method of payment. Payments can also be made by cash or credit card – please contact the General Office on 8872 6300

Refunds (Extra Curricular Activities, Camps and Excursions) please refer to our refund policy.

The school must ensure that the provision of any activity for students does not incur a cost directly on the school and that the activity does not run at a loss. When students withdraw from an activity after payment has been made to the school a refund may be applicable.

- All refunds must be applied for in writing, other than when the school cancels an activity.
- Parents/Guardians must apply for a refund no later than 14 days after the activity was due to take place and include the reason the student did not attend including a medical certificate if applicable.
- A refund will be considered once the viability of the activity and any possible monetary loss to the college is ascertained.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g., textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child does not miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
